1) BOLD STREET

In the past, Bold Street was a hub for wealthy merchants trading in silk, cotton, and luxury goods; now, it is famous for its independent shops and restaurants.

At the top of the street there is also **St Luke's church** that was bombed during the **Blitz** and which remains empty and roofless, a reminder of what happened and an iconic landmark.

We have fit in the **Gothic Liverpool Cathedral**, which you can see from the hotel. It is very close nearby. If we do not have time to go in, think of visiting in your free time. Visitors to Liverpool, in fact, should go in and look for a very particular <u>mouse for good luc</u>k. They also have excellent views from the tower. And a mysterious whispering arch.

Further down the street, you'll pass the Chinese Arch.





2) MUSEUMS

Liverpool has a rich cultural and historical scene, with highlights including **The Beatles Story**, **Tate Liverpool**, and **The Museum of Liverpool**. However, given the intensity of our four-day itinerary; visiting these museums may be unrealistic.

3) THE CAVERN CLUB

No visit to Liverpool is complete without stepping into The Cavern Club, the legendary venue where The Beatles played their early gigs. A must-see for any music enthusiast.

Matthew Street (one of the best streets for nightlife in Liverpool – especially live music).

4) ANFIELD STADIUM

The tour itself is fascinating, as it offers an opportunity to discuss Spion Kop and the Boer War, Thatcher-era Britain, and the working-class backlash after Hillsborough. That said, Anfield has changed over the years-now a larger, more modern stadium, it has lost some of its old, raw character.





5) ALBERT DOCK & QUEEN'S DOCK

The Pier Head area is one of Liverpool's most stunning waterfront spots, home to The Three Graces:

- The Royal Liver Building
- The Cunard Building
- The Port of Liverpool Building

These iconic landmarks define the city's skyline.

6) THE BEATLES STATUE

A must-visit for fans of the Fab Four, this statue near Pier Head is perfect for a quick photo op.

Clse by is the legendary **Superlambanana**—a curious fusion of a lamb and a banana. It is a dangerous creature so it is kept in a cage. You may approach it at your own risk. The Superlambanana likes kids, but she finds them difficult to digest!



7) LIVERPOOL ONE SHOPPING MALL

Just a ten-minute walk away from the hotel, Liverpool One is a shopping and entertainment hub, bustling with street performers and activity (at least pre-COVID). It's a favorite spot for students (and for teachers); there are some notable gems:

- Paperchase Ideal for stationery enthusiasts
- W.H. Smith Great for discounted books
- HMV A nostalgic stop for music and film deals

- Pieminister Classic British pies with modern twists, including vegan options.
- Maray Famous for its falafel and small plates.
- Down the Hatch Affordable veggie/vegan comfort food.
- Bundobust Indian street food and vegetarian-friendly.
- Crust- Wood-fired pizzas and fresh pasta dishes.
- Albert's Schloss- Bavarian-style bier hall with Alpine European cuisine.
